

- If your child has strong aptitude and passion in a field related to a *Nitec* course, the ITE EAE is for him/her.
 - Considerations given for achievements in sports, arts, leadership, entrepreneurship and community service.

ITE Early Admissions Exercise (ITE EAE)

Who Can Apply?

Singapore Citizens (SC) and Singapore Permanent Residents (SPR) who have registered to sit for the GCE N-Level or O-Level examinations in the year of the ITE EAE application

3 things to do!

- Find out more about ITE courses and related career options
 - Course counselling at ITE
 - Online research and visit the ITE website
 - Talk to your teachers, Education & Career Guidance (ECG) counsellors, family/relatives

Prepare for your application

 Prepare the write-up (not more than 100 words) for each course you are applying. Express your passion for the course in your write-up. Include your relevant skills/activities/experiences that demonstrate your aptitude for the course.

If shortlisted, prepare for interview

 Bring along supporting documents e.g. portfolio of related works, evidence of relevant experiences, and CCA records to the interview.

ITE Early Admissions Exercise (ITE EAE)

What does this mean?

- Importance of identifying one's strength and interests
- Doing research of the ITE courses available and the subject requirements
- Early preparation for portfolio/work to be shown during interview
- Close monitoring of your child's attendance and ensuring good behaviour

Partnering Parents

Monitor

- your child's homework and academic progress
 - your child's time on the mobile phone, Internet, TV and online activity
 - your child's attendance, by ensuring your child show up in school and are only supported with MCs if they are unwell. Excuse letters are only permissible due to special cases (eg: death, family-related issue). Maximum three letters per semester.

Partnering Parents

Understand

- the various choices, not just one choice
- your child's interest and qualifying criteria for post secondary education
 - your child has to commit to the choice and no changes will be allowed in Sec 3
